School-to- Work Transition Program Prepares Students for Work

Young adults are better prepared to transition from school to work if they and their families are familiar with the **education, training and employment** services available after they graduate. *Sand Run Supports* provides the supports young adults and their families need to navigate the service system. Through our contracts with local public school systems we assist the student and the family to make informed decisions for creating a long-term transition plan leading to training and employment.

Work Experience

In addition to developing a transition plan based on vocational interests, abilities and needs of the student, we also arrange **real life, hands on opportunities** to put this plan into practice before the student graduates from school. Our coaches train and supervise the student on a job site during regular school hours as part of the students education plan. Transition plans for some students include contacting the Ohio Rehabilitation Services Commission for assistance in gaining competitive employment after the student leaves school. If eligible, these time-limited services could include assessment, training, job development and job coaching.

Leftover Turkey Sandwich

1 1/4 pounds smoked turkey breast, diced

- Kosher salt and freshly ground pepper
- 1 cup chopped scallions
- 3/4 cup chopped celery
- 1/3 cup mayonnaise
- 2 tablespoons Dijon mustard
- 1 cup seedless red grapes, cut in half
- 8 ounces provolone cheese, cut into 1/2 inch cubes
- 1/2 cup sliced almonds, toasted and coarsely chopped (optional)
- 3 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley
- 2 tablespoons snipped fresh chives



Soft whole-grain sandwich of your choice for serving

Directions

Place the turkey in a medium mixing bowl and season with salt and pepper. Add the remaining ingredients (except the bread) and combine. Serve on sandwich bread.

Be Cautious About Giving Info to Census Workers

With the U.S. Census process beginning, the Better Business Bureau (BBB) advises people to be cooperative, but cautious, so as not to become a victim of fraud or identity theft.

If a U.S. Census worker knocks on your door, they will have a badge, a handheld device, a Census Bureau canvas bag, and a confidentiality notice. Ask to see their identification and their badge before answering their questions. However, you should never invite anyone you don't know into your home.

**** Census workers are currently only knocking on doors to verify address information. Do not give your Social Security number, credit card or banking information to anyone, even if they claim they need it for the U.S. Census.** The Census Bureau will not ask for Social Security, bank account, or credit card numbers, nor will employees solicit donations. Any one asking for that information is NOT with the Census Bureau.

Census workers may contact you by telephone, mail, or in person at home. However, the Census Bureau will not contact you by email, so be on the lookout for email scams impersonating the Census.
